What is an Apprentice?

DEFINITION: n.1 (often attrib.) a person who is learning a trade from an experienced skilled worker and who has agreed to work for a set amount of time in that trade.



How does an apprenticeship work?



TO BECOME AN APPRENTICE: a person must find an employer willing to register and train them.



A CERTIFIED JOURNEYPERSON trains the apprentice, while, at the same time, the apprentice goes to school for classroom theory.



Once training and certification is complete, you become a certified Journeyman in your trade.



Some skilled trades require a **CERTIFICATE OF QUALIFICATION.** This certificate shows that you are able to perform all the necessary skills in your trade.



Pathways to Apprenticeship



Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP)

What is OYAP?



A high school program that allows students to work as an apprentice through the Cooperative Education Program (Co-op)



Students can work as registered apprentices, while, at the same time, they complete credits needed to earn their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).

BENEFITS



Earn credits towards your OSSD as well as apply hours worked towards a journey person certificate.



Students may participate in some of the regular apprenticeship training courses through OYAP.



Students may earn a wage during the on-the-job portion of the program.



Return to regular classroom programs after one semester with no penalty.

OYAP: Steps to Apply

You must be working on completing your OSSD and have at least 16 credits towards your OSSD before you start a Co-op.



Choose a trade.



Enroll in a Co-op so you can get a placement and participate in OYAP.



Speak to a Guidance Counselor or Co-op teacher. They can help you find a program that is right for you.



Fill out an OYAP application form so you can enroll with the Ministry of Labour, Training and Skills Development.



The time spent as an apprentice in the workplace will count as credits towards your OSSD.

Apprenticeship Requirements:



- Students must be placed with a qualified employer and follow an on-the-job training program based on specific trade standards.
- They may also receive related theoretical instruction.

Apprenticeship via Dual Credit Program

Dual credit programs are ministry-approved programs that allow students to complete their OSSD and a college diploma, degree, or Certificate of Apprenticeship.



Courses are delivered by both college instructors and secondary school teachers. Students work on approved Ontario secondary school work as well as approved college curriculum.



The focus of these programs is on students who have the potential to succeed but are at risk of not graduating from high school or students under 21 who left high school before graduating and are now returning to school.



OYAP Students in Specialist High Skills Major programs and students who want help with the transition into post-secondary may also participate.

Pre-Apprenticeship Programs

This training is for those who are interested in working in a trade but don't have the skills or experience to get a job as an apprentice.

Training goes for up to 52 weeks and starts at different times throughout the year.

You can receive:

- safety training for skilled trades
- training to improve your academic skills
- basic level apprenticeship in-school training

Pre-apprenticeship training also includes an 8-12 week work placement.

These services are free and the training can be done through colleges or community agencies across Ontario.

To QUALIFY you must be an adult or youth who:

- Graduated high school or
- Left before finishing high school or
- Are currently unemployed or underemployed

To APPLY:

Do you want to know why they're called "Skilled Trades"? Because these careers require many types of skills and abilities.


Not sure where you stand in the skills department?

Time To Upgrade

Adult learning is about you, your goals and needs.

Scenario 1: Person Age 21

- Learns differently
- Classroom was not a good fit
- Needs flexibility - works shift work
- Wants to do an apprenticeship but not sure where to start
- Contacted local Learning Centre about upgrading skills
- 2nd step College evening program - **SUCCESS**

Scenario 2: Person Age 43

- Laid off from a long time job
- Needs computer skills
- Wants to go to college
- Referred by local Learning Centre to College Access program
- Gained entrance to desired program at college after completing the courses needed - **SUCCESS**

Scenario 3: Person Age 32

- Children have started school
- Didn't graduate from grade 12
- Ready to enter the workforce but wants to get diploma first
- Contacted local Learning Centre for upgrading before entering credit programs
- Ongoing support from Learning Centre during credit process - **SUCCESS**

Scenario 4: Person Age 57

- Feel they don't have the skills needed to move into a new position at workplace
- Assessment at local Learning Centre helped to identify areas they want to improve
- Upgraded computer skills and took some online courses to help develop confidence
- Applied for a new position when the next one came up - **SUCCESS**

WORK SMART—WORK SAFE

WORKPLACE SAFETY & INSURANCE BOARD (WSIB):

Every year many avoidable injuries occur on the job site. These injuries can happen when people either do not know their rights or they are distracted. Know your rights and responsibilities and help protect yourself.

YOUR RIGHTS:

THE RIGHT TO KNOW:

You have the right to know about any dangerous machinery, unsafe materials, and anything else that can make you ill or hurt you.

THE RIGHT TO PARTICIPATE:

You have the right to participate in health and safety inspections and recommendations in your workplace. You also have the right to participate in health and safety training.

THE RIGHT TO REFUSE:

You have the right to refuse work and equipment you think is unsafe. This is the law. No one can suspend you, fire you, or dock your pay.



YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES:

WORK SMART, WORK SAFE:

Don't fool around on the job. You are responsible for yourself and your coworkers' safety.

REPORT UNSAFE CONDITIONS:

If you see anything that looks wrong, broken or faulty tell your boss - immediately! Don't wait for an accident to happen.

DRESS FOR THE JOB:

Wear all the protective equipment or clothing your job requires. Make sure it is the proper fit and get trained in using and maintaining it. It could save you from injury or death.

KNOW EMERGENCY PROCEDURES:

Find out where the fire alarms, extinguishers and exits are located. Make sure that they're accessible and not blocked.

Ask your employer if there are any other emergency procedures that apply to your workplace.

REPORT ALL INJURIES:

If you are injured, get immediate First Aid and then report the injury to your supervisor. Make sure your employer files the proper reports with the Workplace Safety & Insurance Board.

Compulsory Trade: A trade in which registration as an apprentice, journeyperson candidate or certification as a journeyperson is mandatory

Certificate of Qualification (C of Q)

Confirms its holder has the skills, knowledge and experience that meet industry standards of practice for the trade.

ESDC

Employment and Social Development Canada

MLTSD

Ministry of Labour Training and Skills Development

NOC

National Occupational Classification.
Note: A NOC Code may include a number of different occupation names.

OCOT

Ontario College Of Trades
Note: In late 2018, the Ontario Government is winding down OCOT and will develop a replacement model with expected implementation in early 2019.

OYAP

Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program

Red Seal



Interprovincial Red Seal Trades: designated trades that are governed by regulations under the Provincial and Territorial Apprenticeship Acts.

V

Voluntary Trade: A trade in which certification and College membership are not legally required to practice the trade.
